





In liberalized economies, where the entry and exit of enterprises are unhindered, the cultivation of resilient and robust brand name becomes paramount to weathering challenging

What is a Brand name? It is a distinctive name applied by a manufacturer or an organisation to a particular product or service. Brand names are also embodied in a company or organisation's Logo. A logo is a symbol usually composed of words, images or colours. The primary function of a brand logo is to convey a specific message, rooted in a value proposition. For example, Rotary as a Global organisation established in

1905, has a Brand Logo composed of a wheel with a few lines, which in essence illustrate "civilization and movement". Any item that bears the Rotary logo signifies one element; "service to humanity anchored on "serving above self" as a Principal Motto of Rotary.

This motto epitomizes Rotary's commitment to global volunteerism, a cause fervently embraced by all Rotarians.



It should be noted that "Service" is a natural law. As Pope Francis has counselled; "trees do not eat their own fruit, the sun does not shine for itself nor can rivers drink their own water, and flowers do not give out that flagrance for themselves but for us to enjoy".

RC Entebbe Base to extend and equip a maternity
ward at Bunapongo Health Centre III in Mbale
District. 'Beyond Tree Planting' project: A 5-year
Environmental sustainability project starting
with Graces Secondary School Kasangati to
increase youth understanding and engagement
in environmental protection and climate change
adaptation.

Malaria prevention & treatment project: Enhance disease prevention and improve hygiene conditions in Kyeyagalire and Bunampongo through a small global grant project. Mviringo Youth project: Convert waste to charcoal and other materials, economically empowering the youth and improving the environment by recycling waste into briquettes. Suam WASH project: Implement a global grant clean water project in SUAM – Bukwo District, providing a solar-powered water system to over 4,800 people.

### 2. Membership engagement, growth, and retention:

Focus on providing diverse programs and opportunities to meet members' needs, keeping each buddy team engaged in projects and Club activities.

### 3. Community outreach and engagement:

Actively engage with the local community through various service projects, partnerships, and events, increasing Rotary's visibility and attracting new members.

### 4. Increase contributions to the Rotary Foundation and Polio Plus:

Steer the Club towards significant contributions to global grant funds supporting Rotary's seven focus areas.

### 5. Increase our visibility as a Club:

Congratulations, Mom, on this welldeserved honor. We are beyond excited to support you and witness the great feats you will undoubtedly achieve.



Make a date with yourself. Plan regular breaks throughout the year to replenish your soul.



# **Projects**

### **Our Signature Projects**

As a club, we have lined up a number of projects we set out to achieve in the Rotary year 2024/25, and moving forward. They include:

### **Kasanje St. Kizito Primary School-Suuka**

The Rotary Club of Lubowa adopted Kasanje village and St. Kizito Primary School – Suuka as the focal point. Currently with a pupil population of 418 of whom 172 are in the boarding section, the Club has over time delivered on a number of projects which include among others:-

- Construction of washrooms for both girls and boys,
- Provided a 23,000 litre water harvest tank,
- Procured a Makiga interlocking brick manufacturing machine and trained the community to use it.

In the Irresistible rotary year 2024 / 2025, the Club will complete the multi-purpose block for use as classrooms and mainhall and also initiate the global grant process for the WASH project.

#### **The Saum Community Water Project:**

This is a global grant project valued at USD 35,000 to provide water in Suam – Bukwo District – Uganda / Kenya Boarder. This water and sanitation project

intervention will provide a solar powered water system and hygiene education for 4,800 people.

### The Bunapongo maternal and child health project.

This is a multi-club global grant project focusing on the Bunapongo Health Centre III – Mbale District. The Rotary Club of Lubowa will partner with Rotary Clubs of Kajjansi, Entebbe Base, and Mbale City D9213. Our intervention aims to improve reproductive health services, maternal and child health services; by increasing and secluding the maternal ward space, equipping the wards and delivery room; procuring a sustainable means of transport to facilitate main hospital referrals, training of medical staff and the expectant and new mothers in the community. The intervention will impact over 16,000 community members.

### 'Beyond Tree Planting' - Go Green Project

In the Irresistible year 24/25, the DGs vision to 'plant the balance' ties in very well with this go-green project. In our vision however, this goes beyond tree planting and looks at inculcating a culture of sustaining the environment through the youth. The Rotary Club of Lubowa will start its pilot project with an already identified Secondary School in a bid to introduce the students to the holistic approach to tree planting with an aspect of the broader understanding





and undertaking of environmental protection and climate change adaptation at school and community levels. We shall open a recording studio to run "It Starts With Me", a Mission Green club at the School and register them as A Mission Go-green club. The Club will then establish a nursery for indigenous trees and other plants at the Secondary School with the aim of using it as a practical learning hub for tree planting, and a long-term intervention for accessing planting materials, while leveraging on the vast resource of the youth in the schools and the communities they come from. The Rotary Club of Lubowa will then support leadership and skills development of the students. This is designed to encourage the youth to exploit their inherent skills and apply themselves as players in innovation, and problem solving with a focus on environmental protection and climate change adaptation.

The Club will also Endeavor to plant the balance every month at different locations in support of the DGs vision.

### Malaria Control at Bukasakya and Lufuka-Bunamwaya

The Club applied for the small malaria grants to support the control of malaria in the two areas. The malaria intervention project in Bukasakya-Mbale District where the Club will be undertaking the Bunapongo MCH global grant project will mainly focus on controlling malaria in mothers and children who present at Bunapongo HC III. This Malaria grant project is valued at USD \$ 10,884.94.

The malaria small grant for Lufuka – Bunamwaya in Makindye Ssabagabo division, will focus on cleaning the drainage channels and providing relief items to control malaria in this slum area in the Lubowa neighbourhood where the Club is situated. This Malaria grant project is estimated to cost USD \$ 10,000.00





## **UGANDA ROAD FUND (URF)**

he Uganda Road Fund (URF) was established in 2008 by an Act of Parliament-URF Act, 2008. Its purpose is to finance routine and periodic maintenance of public roads in the country. It started operations in January 2010. The Fund derives its mandate from section 6 of the URF Act 2008. The fund's mandate is to provide adequate and stable financing to maintain the 80,000km of public roads in Uganda, principally from road user charges (RUCs).



#### **UGANDA ROAD FUND'S SOURCE OF FUNDS**

More than 90% is from parliamentary appropriations. We believe that sustainable road maintenance lies in actualizing the 2G fund since Parliament appropriations are insufficient. URF continues strategic engagements with MFPED and other stakeholders on the amendment of URA law.

## 14 YEARS: OUR SUSTAINABLE ROAD **MAINTENANCE OPERATIONS AT A GLANCE**

The URF aspires to principles of economy, efficiency, and effectiveness in its operations. It also seeks to operate in a business-like manner, while remaining responsive to road user needs.

Manages Uganda road network asset valued at UGX 9.8 trillion. Road transport is Uganda's most dominant mode, carrying 96.5 % and 95 % of freight cargo and passenger

traffic respectively.

- Financing road maintenance. The fund has been financing road maintenance since 2010 through 1700 designated agencies. Funding is timely, dependable (Quarterly), predictable, and impactful.
- **URF Special Projects.** The Special projects are outside the routine planned works of



designated agencies, and are fully funded by The Fund. The special projects are set out to be an augmented intervention meant to sporadically develop, improve, upgrade, or maintain a section or a road. The Special projects are Kampala Metropolitan multi-billion interventions that have spurring local economic growth, addressing traffic congestion, road safety, drainage systems, and inter-connectivity.

- **Axle control.** Financing operations and maintenance of UNRA weighbridges.
- Road Safety. Funds road safety initiatives through designated agencies at UGX 20bn annually for maintenance of street lights and traffic junctions; installation of road signs and guardrails; marking of roads; demarcation of road reserves; improvement of road humps; and road kerb painting.
- **Ferry operations.** Linking communities by financing operations and maintenance of all 12 ferries under UNRA at UGX 30b annually.
- The Special Board Projects. The special board projects is an initiative started by Uganda Road Fund in 2019. The projects programme extends periodic maintenance to town council and municipal roads outside the normal annual maintenance plans. The Board Planning, Policy, and Strategy committee (PSBC) under Uganda Road Fund oversees the board special projects program.
- RUSS. Finances the Road User Satisfaction Survey (RUSS). The 2021 RUSS is the 8th of its kind in Uganda and the 4th to be undertaken by URF as an accountability and monitoring mechanism through which road users provide feedback to providers of services in the road sector.
- Research. Uganda Road Fund finances research
  of alternative technology for maintenance of
  public roads like cost sealing to address issues
  like scarcity of quality gravel among other
  challenges.
- **Bridges.** The Road Fund finances the maintenance of all bridges on public roads.

- Emergency fund. Emergency maintenance funding for roads damaged by unexpected natural occurrences.
- **District Roads Committee creation.**Every district is required to constitute and operationalize a District Roads Committee (DRC) in fulfillment of section 25(2) of Uganda Road Fund Act, 2008. The committee plays an important role in the prioritization and approval of annual road maintenance programmes.
- M&E Reports. Monitoring is a tool the Fund employs in measuring the effectiveness of its road maintenance funding strategies as mandated in the URF Act, 2008.
- Fund stability. The Fund successfully completed Uganda Road Fund/Public Producurement and Disposal of Public Assets-URF/PPDA permanent office.
- Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR). Our CSR initiatives focus on partnering with Rotary for Cancer Run and Road safety initiatives every year. Other initiatives the Fund supports are health and the environment, for example the Fund runs "Bulungi bwansi", through the Road Boards of DAs, a graduate trainee programme, and the Fund passes on HIV/AIDS awareness messages.
